Roundtable Poets of Hot Springs hosted a *Poets as Visionaries* program that began with a Friday night of poetry and song. Kai Coggin, the featured speaker, shared poetry on Saturday from two of her books and offered insight on poems members had submitted for critique. Thank you, Hot Springs branch. A job well done!

The year, where did it go? As I sit to write, I am reminded of *Memory* by Ted Kooser in which he creates a thirty-six line poem with one period. The pace is maddening. He likened it to a tornado. It quietly budded into spring, wildly blossomed into summer, and has arrived at autumn with dust trailing a mile behind. Poetry Day, October 22, Hot Springs:

Our thanks to the Roundtable Poets of Hot Springs for hosting PRA's 2016 Poetry Day conference. Each year this conference honors Arkansas Poet Laureate Rosa Zagnoni Marinoni (1953-1969) who established the first Arkansas Poetry Day on October 15, 1948. Poetry Day Chair John Crawford led a Friday night event including a sing-along, read-around and impromptu contest. The contest winners were: 1st Jim Barton, 2nd Fay Guinn, and a tie for 3rd between Marilyn Joyner & Bethel Kymes. Our hosts provided food and great hospitality. On Saturday featured speaker Kai Coggin of Hot Springs shared wonderful readings from her poetry books and led group critiques. Kai is a creative writing teacher, poet, author, workshop leader, and performer. She also serves on the Arts in Education Roster for the Arkansas Arts Council. She blew us away with her passionate readings and observations on the critiques. We had a chance to visit with her and buy her books before lunch break.

PRA Business Meeting, October 22: President Dennis Patton read the Arkansas Poetry Day Proclamation and noted that the photo with Arkansas Governor Asa Hutchinson included Arkansas Poet Laureate Peggy Vining, NFSPS President Jim Barton, and PRA President Dennis Patton. After lunch President Patton conducted a business meeting and discussed several updates and issues.

- 1) <u>2017 Conferences</u>: PRA's 2017 Spring Celebration will be April 22nd in Benton. Poetry Day will be in Little Rock on October 21st. More details to come.
- 2) <u>2nd VP Position</u>: Members voted to amend the PRA constitution to eliminate the 2nd Vice President position. The Monthly Contest Chair duties will be appointed.
- 3) <u>Anthology</u>: Members discussed PRA's annual anthology and Kate Lacy volunteered to Chair its publication and contest. Kate and Mark Barton will

first study PRA's options and make recommendations on how/when to publish the anthology in the future. The anthology will not be published in 2017.

- 4) Student Chair: PRA is seeking a Student Contest Chair again for middle and high school contests. The new chair Timothy Tripp took a job out of state. Please contact Dennis Patton if you are interested in this role. Student contest materials will be posted on PRA's website and distributed to all branches/members.
- 5) <u>Election of Officers</u>: Nominations Chair Kate Lacy asked members to contact her if interested in serving on PRA's elected board beginning July 1, 2017. Ballots will be in PRA's February newsletter. Be sure to vote.
- 6) Collegiate Contest: Roger Carter has agreed to fund the contest in perpetuity as a memorial to his wife Jeannie Dolan Carter. The contest guidelines and due date will remain much the same, but with no entry fee. Donna Smith will chair the contest. Guidelines will be distributed to all members and posted on PRA's website. Please alert Donna if you can help contact any of the 50 colleges statewide in November.
- 7) State Fair Poetry Contests: PRA-sponsored Best-of-Show poetry winners in 4 age groups at the 2016 Arkansas State Fair are: Catherine Moran, \$25/Adult (Little Rock); Shane Cramer, \$25/Senior Youth (Alexander); Brooke Elliott, \$15/Junior Youth (Austin); and Joe Boone, \$10/Youth (Searcy). Other winners will receive ribbons/cash from the fair in November, and PRA will post a winners list on our website.
- 8) <u>Merit Award</u>: President Patton presented the 2016 Merit Award to Donna Smith for her work on the newsletter, various contests and PR efforts.
- 9) <u>Contest Winners</u>: Frieda Patton announced the winners in the absence of Poetry Day Contest Chair Pat Laster. (A list of winners was emailed to all members immediately following the conference, posted on the PRA website, and mailed with the November newsletter for members without email.) Before announcing the Sybil Nash Abrams contest winners, Jim Barton shared a short biography on Mrs. Abrams (1900-1968), a widely published poet/author who appeared in the International Who's Who in Poetry Anthology. Our continued thanks to Mrs. Abrams and her family.

Karen Hayes (River Market) is developing the <u>Laman Poetry Scribble</u> writers' circle. They meet monthly on the 2nd Tuesday from 6-7:30PM at the William F.

Laman Public Library in North Little Rock. At the first meeting they used the Laman Gallery art exhibit as inspiration to write and read around. The group welcomes anyone who wants to write poetry, with or without experience. Karen also is offering poetry to "regular" people at the <u>Dogtown Poetry on Demand at</u> the Argenta Art Walk each 3rd Friday of the month from 5 to 8PM at the Laman Argenta Branch Library in North Little Rock. She tells patrons, "You name it; I'll write about it." She sets up her table with a sign, tip jar and her 1971 jade green Olivetti typewriter. If patrons are stumped on a subject for their poem, she offers a little box of words they can draw and discuss. The poems are free. Tips are voluntary and donated to a charity like "Friends of the Library." She says, "Twenty dollar bills make me very happy." She types the poem, reads it to the patron, then takes a picture of the poem to keep, plus a picture of the patron with the poem, if they're willing. Her best gig so far was the recent Little Rock Pride Fest at the Clinton Presidential Library in Little Rock. She wrote for 5 hours and had a line at her table! She also offered "poetry quickies," short, face-to-face, memorized poems as samples. Karen makes her free poetry service available at events for the sheer pleasure of seeing people value poetry.
