Did You Know?

On February 5th PRA will be 83 years old. Poets Roundtable of Arkansas was first organized February 5, 1931. Happy Birthday, PRA!

<u>A Bit of History – Dr. Lily Peter (1891-1991):</u>

PRA's spring luncheon is named in honor of Dr. <u>Lily Peter</u>, who served as Arkansas 3rd Poet Laureate from 1971 to 1991. Lily Peter was a distinguished author, successful farmer, teacher, musician, conservationist and philanthropist. Born in Phillips County, she was the first of ten children. When her father died in 1907, she took over the farm responsibilities, plus the care of her siblings and her ill mother. She struggled financially on a teacher's salary, but managed the farm well and eventually bought a second farm with her brother. After his death, she managed both farms and became a millionaire. While teaching and managing two large farms, Peter studied English at Columbia and Vanderbilt universities, received a master's degree from Vanderbilt and also studied violin at Juilliard. She was a generous patron of the arts, financing the college education of many students, the construction of a cultural auditorium in Helena, and even the performance of the Philadelphia Orchestra in Little Rock. She appeared on ABC News with Peter Jennings and in Look magazine because of her

unusual promotion of fine arts in the state. She continued to write throughout her life. Her published works represent a mixture of introspective, lyrical poetry and historical poetry, mostly about the Arkansas <u>Delta</u>. Many of Peter's papers and taped interviews are in the archives at the <u>University of Central Arkansas (UCA)</u> in Conway. (See more at <u>www.encyclopediaofarkansas.net</u>.)
