We missed you but are grateful that you are so active. We enjoyed hearing Pat Durmon share encouraging words to help us reach our potential by utilizing our muse.

I would like to share an event that took place a few days earlier. As you know, Jo McDougall is Arkansas's current Poet Laureate. In May, we accompanied Jo to the state capitol when Governor Hutchinson presented her with the proclamation naming her Poet Laureate. He asked her to write a poem about hope in Arkansas. When we went to receive the proclamation for Poetry Day, I invited Jo to go with us. Usually this entails a photo-op in the Governor's conference room. When Governor Hutchinson came for the presentation, Jo told him she had written the poem he had requested. He asked us to wait a minute as he finished another photo- op on the other end of the room. He came back to us and invited us into his office. We were seated, he called in his staff, and stood to read the beautiful poem Jo had written. He shared his thoughts and expressed his gratitude for the poem and also to us as poets. It was an especially proud moment for poetry in Arkansas and Poets' Roundtable. #### Poetry Day Conference, October 13th, Little Rock:

PRA celebrated its 71<sup>st</sup> annual Poetry Day on October 13th at the Butler Center for Arkansas Studies, in Little Rock. President Dennis Patton welcomed members and guests, including the four children of former PRA President Betty Heidelberger. Poetry Day Chair Amanda Partridge read the Governor's Proclamation of Poetry Day and a short history of past Poet Laureate Rosa Zagnoni Marinoni who established the first Arkansas Poetry Day on October 15, 1948. Then Amanda introduced the featured speaker, accomplished poet/author Pat Durmon of Norfork, Arkansas. Pat spoke on how poets are storytellers who write about what they know from everyday life. She encouraged poets to have others critique their work, and she read a poem by Arkansas Poet Laureate Jo McDougall entitled "This Morning." Pat also encouraged poets to enter the "arena," as President Theodore Roosevelt said, to share their work. Attendees enjoyed a skit by Pat (as muse) and Harding Stedler (as poet). Pat then presented critiques of member poems submitted in advance.

After lunch President Patton held a business meeting and recognized members lost during the year: Arkansas' 6th Poet Laureate Peggy Vining of Little Rock, NFSPS President and PRA Treasurer Jim Barton of Huttig, and longtime PRA member Dean Henning of Alexander. Discussion of business items included:

**Nominating Committee -** Frieda Patton is serving as Nominating Committee Chair for the 2019-2021 election of PRA officers. The process is ongoing. Ballots will be posted in the February 2019 newsletter for members to vote by February 28th.

**2019 Spring Celebration** – PRA's 2019 Dr. Lily Peter Spring Celebration will be April 13<sup>th</sup> in Little Rock at the Cox Building. Guest speaker will be H.K. (Heather) Hummel, Assistant Professor of Creative Writing at the University of Arkansas.

**2018 Arkansas State Fair** - PRA again sponsored the Best-of -Show category in the Arkansas State Fair. Frieda read the winners' list compiled by Chair Donna Smith who was absent. PRA winners included: Cathy Moran, John McPherson, Dennis Patton, Sara Gipson, and Donna Nelson, who won the *Best-of-Show* in the Adult category. Some student contests didn't have entries, and a suggestion was made that the information be sent to 4-H groups. (See attached complete list of State Fair winners also posted on PRA's website.).

2019 Jeanie Dolan Carter Memorial Collegiate Contest (JDC) - Information for both the state JDC contest and the national NFSPS-CUP (College Undergrad Poetry Contest) needs to be distributed statewide in November. Members are asked to promote these contests with colleges, English professors and students in their areas. Our goal is to reach ALL colleges in Arkansas. Members willing to contact a college are asked to please notify Collegiate Contest Chair Donna Smith. (See guidelines for both college contests attached and posted on PRA's website.)

2019 Middle and High School Student Contests -- November is also the time to distribute middle and high school student contest information. Like the college contests, we ask members to help promote these contests statewide. Each branch is asked to reach out to teachers, schools, libraries and students in its area. (See attached contest copies also posted on PRA's website.)

(FYI – Student Contest Co-Chair Laura Bridges heard an interview in August with a Creative Writing Professor/Author who talked about how schools across the U.S. are dropping humanities programs (creative writing, English, art and more) to add more STEM classes. This is really a shame. We will have more math and science majors but will they know how to form concrete sentences or interview for jobs? The humanities are what make us well-rounded people. The love of books and writing should have a prominent place in society. The generation following the Millennials will be denied these pleasures and will suffer. Grammar is very important in business. Very. Laura says, "It is my hope that PRA continues to have funds to support our student and college contests. They are more important than ever.")

**Poetry Day Contest sponsorship forms** -- This year there were some contest sponsorship submissions that were vague and hard to interpret. When completing the forms for next year, please be clear on requirements for the entries. (Forms for the 2019 Poetry Day Contest Sponsors will be distributed with the February PRA newsletter and due February 28<sup>th</sup> to PRA Treasurer Cathy Moran.)

The Jim Barton Memorial -- PRA has collected \$451 to date in memorial funds for Jim Barton. Discussion was held on how to best honor Jim with the funds. A motion was passed to sponsor a NFSPS contest -- The Jim Barton Memorial Award-- using the \$100 PRA usually provides to sponsor a contest and \$50 from Jim's memorial fund with prizes of \$75, 50, and \$25 for

the first year. If anyone would like to donate, please contact Cathy Moran.

Merit Award - Dennis presented the prestigious Merit Award for 2018 to Frieda Patton. In June the PRA Board unanimously voted to recognize Frieda with this honor, richly deserved for her long-time support and promotion of poetry and poets through the goals of PRA.

Finally, Poetry Day Contest Chair Marie Allison announced all of the winners, and Dennis Patton announced the Sybil Nash Abrams awards. The \$1,000 SNA winner this year was Pat Durmon with her poem "Don't Underestimate the Warren-Hogan House or the Crumbs Left Behind." I have spent the time setting up readings, contacting the towns and cities I have lived in of the appointment, and structuring my purpose and platform. Stacy Pendergrast has signed on as my press secretary, and she is invaluable--a wonderful writer and support. She wrote and sent out press releases soon after the appointment.

Governor Hutchinson commissioned me as one of my first official duties, to write a poem on the hopeful future of Arkansas. I delivered it to him on the day of the photo shoot proclaiming Poetry Day in Arkansas. He seemed pleased and after the photo shoot read it aloud to a small group, including Stacy, Dennis and Frieda Patton in his office. That was exciting!

My platform is Poetry ASAP: I believe poetry should be Accessible, Surprising, Available, and Part of our everyday lives. I hope to promote this message via readings, workshops and talks, especially to the young people of Arkansas and elsewhere.

I appreciate your ongoing support and faith in me, and I welcome all suggestions regarding ways to promote poetry in our everyday lives.

<u>WHAT</u>: Students may choose any subject for the poem. Please submit one entry per poet in Free Verse form, within 40 lines. Vulgar language will be disqualified.

**WHEN:** Entries will be accepted January 1, 2019 through March 15, 2019 (postmarked). Winners will be announced in April.

**WHERE:** Winners will be invited to receive their awards at PRA's Dr. Lily Peter Spring Celebration in April 2019. Checks will be mailed to winners who cannot attend.

<u>HOW</u>: Prizes will be awarded for: lst Place \$500, 2nd Place \$300, and 3rd Place \$200. There will be no Honorable Mentions or critiques. Judges' decisions will be final. Winners' qualifications will be verified before prizes are awarded.

#### MEUDT and KAHN AWARDS

Two winners will be chosen for the College Undergraduate Poetry (CUP) Competition, one receiving the **Edna Meudt Memorial Award**; the other receiving the **Florence Kahn Memorial Award**. For each winner, prizes include:

- \$500 cash prize.
- Publication of the manuscript as a perfect-bound 6"x9" chapbook, that will be marketed through Amazon.com.
- 75 free copies of the chapbook.
- Invitation to read from winning work at the 2019 NFSPS Convention in Santa Fe, NM.
- \$300 travel stipend, if attending the convention.
- Complimentary registration for the entire convention.
- Complimentary dinner on the evening the winners read. (Winners are responsible for the balance of their convention costs, e.g., meals and lodging, and for any guests who accompany them).
- Complimentary one-year membership in an NFSPS-affiliated state poetry society of the winner's choosing and in NFSPS.
- Book release at the NFSPS annual convention. While winners are present at the convention, they will
  be assisted in selling their stock of books directly and/or in the convention book room and will receive
  all proceeds from those sales.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Undergraduates working toward a degree in an accredited U.S. college or university during the contest submission period are eligible to enter the CUP Competition.

#### **SUBMISSION GUIDELINES**

• **Application and Manuscript.** Complete the application form and upload your manuscript file online at www.nfsps.submittable.com. The manuscript must be a single document that contains only your title page followed by ten poems. Once you have uploaded the file, you cannot make edits. Acceptable file formats include .doc and .docx (MS Word) and .pdf.

- **Fees.** There is a \$10.00 contest submission fee and no charge to open an account at Submittable.com. You may keep your Submittable account permanently.
- Submission Period. An electronic switch will open the Submissions function in the first minute December 1, 2018 and close it automatically at midnight Pacific Standard Time on January 31, 2019. Make sure you know your local time relative to PST. Students in Hawaii and Alaska are advised to submit no later than January 30. Indeed, we urge every entrant to submit early so that our committee can advise if you encounter problems, we likely cannot help if you wait until the last day of the contest.
- Alternative Submission Request. Approval by the contest chair's prior approval by January 15, 2019, is required to enter the competition by any other means than online submission as described above. He will decide on a case-by-case basis whether to accept paper manuscripts. Unauthorized paper manuscripts or e-mailed manuscripts will not be accepted. If the chair approves an alternative submission, he will provide you instructions on how to proceed. Send your name, address, telephone number and email address with your request to: Steven Concert, CUP Chair, 49 Kitchen Avenue, Harveys Lake, PA 18618. If he allows a paper submission, it must reach him by noon, January 31, 2019.

#### MANUSCRIPT GUIDELINES: Not following ALL guidelines disqualifies a submission.

- **No Identification**. There must be no author identification on any page of the manuscript.
- **Title Page and Ten Poems.** The manuscript will include only the title page and ten (10) original, unpublished poems. Note that poems posted on a public website or public social media are considered published. You will be required to confirm that your poetry is original and unpublished.
- **Titles.** Except for haiku and related Japanese forms, each poem must be titled.
- **Poem Line Width.** Line width limit is 60 characters, including punctuation marks and spaces between words.
- Erasure poems and others derived from prose. Contestants may not use any material copyrighted by another author as the basis for their poems. Please identify any source and verify that it is in the public domain.
- **Title Page.** The first manuscript page will include **only the manuscript title**, centered both vertically and horizontally on the page and followed by a page break.
- **Poem Arrangement.** Manuscript page 2 of your manuscript will be the first of your ten poems, with the others following in the order they would appear in a chapbook. Insert a page break after the text for each poem.
- Fonts and Spacing. Use a 12-point standard font (e.g., Times New Roman) in black text. Colored text and script, fancy or unusual fonts will not be accepted. Single-space your poems and start lines at the left margin, unless you are **clearly** using spacing as a poetic device.
- **Pagination.** Each page must include a footer with the title of the manuscript in the lower left corner and the page number in the lower right corner.
- Auxiliary pages (dedication, acknowledgments, cover letter, bio, etc.) Do NOT include these in your initial entry. If you win, you will be asked for a brief biography and will have opportunity to include the other elements during the editing phase.
- **Literary Standards**. While we honor the First Amendment right of free speech, be aware that any profanity used must be necessary to the literary integrity of your poem. Our judge will view the gratuitous use of profanity as a crutch for shoddy craftsmanship or as cliche that has lost its shock value. The NFSPS will not give prizes for, nor publish work that perpetuates derogatory stereotypes. Nor will it

accept work that is obscene, prurient or sexually graphic, hate-mongering, or abusive of any social, racial, ethnic, religious, or gender group.

#### JUDGING and NOTIFICATION OF WINNERS

- **Judging.** Manuscripts will be screened for compliance with contest rules. Up to 60 entries will be sent to a judge who will remain anonymous until the winners are announced. Manuscripts are judged blind (identified only by machine generated number) from those entries complying with all contest guidelines. Decisions are final.
- **Notification of Winners.** By email on Monday, March 11, entrants will be notified of who has won and/or placed in the competition. Winners will be announced in the April issue of *Strophes*, the NFSPS newsletter, available at <a href="https://www.nfsps.com">www.nfsps.com</a>.
