2020 Dr. Lily Peter Spring Celebration

The Poets' Roundtable of Arkansas will host its 2020 Dr. Lily Peter Spring Celebration on April 18th at the Butler Center for Arkansas Studies, Room 124, 401 President Clinton Avenue in Little Rock. The Center is located on the Central Arkansas Library's main campus in the River Market next door to the Cox Building where many PRA meetings have been. The first floor has a gift shop and the meeting room is located at the rear of the shop. Registration will begin at 9:15 AM. There is no registration fee and lunch will be on your own. There are a number of eateries located across the street at the River Market.

Laura Trigg of River Market Poets will serve as Spring Celebration Chair. Featured speaker is Jake Sawyer, a poet and writer from Mena, Arkansas. Jake is currently a senior at the University of the Ozarks in Clarksville, Arkansas, and is finishing a degree in Environmental Studies and English in preparation for a life spent exploring and advocating for the natural world. He received first prize in the Poet's Roundtable of Arkansas Jeannie Dolan Carter Memorial Collegiate Poetry Contest in 2018. He also won the University of the Ozarks' Project Poet competition in 2017, then went on to manage and host the event in subsequent years. Poetry Day 2020 will be October 10th at the Darragh Center in the Central Arkansas Library in Little Rock. Laura Bridges will act as PD Chair. Marie Allison will be PD Contest Chair. Poetry Day Contest Sponsorships with checks payable to PRA are due February 28th to PRA Treasurer Dennis Patton, 2512 Springhill Circle, Alexander, AR 72002. Entries with checks payable to PRA will be due by August 15th to Marie Allison, 165 St. Andrews, Hot Springs, AR 71913. The subject for the prestigious Sybil Nash Abrams contest this year is Arkansas Towns. Watch PRA's website for more information.

<u>Door Prizes at PRA's Two Annual Events:</u> The board voted to seek volunteers to provide snacks and door prizes for Spring Celebration and Poetry Day events each year. <u>PRA Sponsorship of Arkansas State Fair 2020 Contests</u> is still being negotiated with new management at the State Fair. PRA's board agreed this partnership meets with PRA's mission to promote poetry statewide to all ages. A final decision must be made by March 1st. If the sponsorship is agreed, contest instructions will be posted on the State Fair's website and on PRA's.

<u>Honorary Member Selection:</u> Due to the death of Honorary Member Mildred McKinney in September, the board selected another long-time member to replace her. Congratulations to Harding Stedler, PRA's newest Honorary Member.

Poetry Day Message from President Frieda Patton:

PRA Members and Friends,

In 1947, progressive American poets campaigned for a National Poetry Day. Among the pioneers of the group was Rosa Zagnoni Marinoni, who had previously founded the first poetry club in Arkansas and the southwestern United States in 1925—the University-City Poetry Club. On August 23, 1948, Arkansas became the eleventh state to recognize October 15 as National Poetry Day. In 1963, the Arkansas Senate established it as Poetry Day in Arkansas, and in 1969 Governor Winthrop Rockefeller named the day in honor of Marinoni. Each year this conference honors Arkansas Poet Laureate Rosa Zagnoni Marinoni who served 1953 through 1970.

Always celebrated in October, Poetry Day in Arkansas festivities include contests with awards totaling about \$4,100. The Sybil Nash Abrams Award, given to state residents only, offers prizes of \$1,000, \$400, and \$250. An annual Merit Award is presented at this meeting to the member who has exhibited outstanding service in encouraging poets in the art, and promoted an appreciation of poetry in the community. This meeting is conducted by members of PRA and is held in a central Little Rock location. There is no charge to attend the conference.

The 2020 Poetry Day in Arkansas has been scheduled for October 10, 2020 at the Darragh Center Auditorium, Main Library, 100 Rock Street, Little Rock, AR.

PRA Member Highlight – John Crawford:

John W Crawford is a long-time member of PRA, and a native of Ashdown, AR. He graduated from Ouachita Baptist with a B.A. and B.S.E., from Drake University with a M.S.E., and from Oklahoma State U. with an Ed.D. in Literature Teaching. He taught writing and literature in Junior High and High School in Greene County, Iowa. Then he was a Literature and Writing Instructor at Clinton College in Iowa. After that he was an Adjunct Professor of Writing at Oklahoma State U. before moving to Henderson State University in Arkadelphia, Arkansas as Professor of English Studies for 30 years. He's been Professor Emeritus and Adjunct Professor at HSU since 1997.

John has published poetry in numerous literary journals and anthologies nationally, won numerous poetry prizes regionally and nationally, including two 1st prizes in PRA's Sybil Nash Abrams Contest (plus one second and two honorable mentions), the Arkansas Haiku Prize, the Georgia Narrative Prize, and the Grand Prize of the International Poetry Society. He has 5 volumes of poetry and has submitted another for publication. As a faculty member at HSU, he read his poetry at various societies and national literary conventions. He was a longstanding member of the College English Association, and in 1997 was awarded Scholar/Teacher Status for his many years of service.

As a 51 year member of PRA, he has served as state PRA treasurer and as President of the Hot Springs chapter. In 1988 he won PRA's Merit Award. John also was named an Honorary Member of PRA. He is a charter member of the 31 year old *Wednesday Night Poetry Readings* in Hot Springs and continues to be active in poetry circles statewide.

After the editor of SOUTHERN STANDARD's poetry column died, the Standard's editor Joe May asked Pat to resume the job. (She began it while living in Arkadelphia during the late 1990s). She did, vowing to use only poems from poets in the southwestern part of Arkansas where the readership is. She's also preparing a year-long flip calendar of haiku that she hopes to have ready by Lucidity in late March/early April.

Barbara Robinette (Baxter County) published 5 poems in PRA's *Turning Home* anthology, a poem in a Highland Park Poetry Publication, a haiku in the Haiku Society of America's anthology *A Moment's Longing*, and 2 senryu in the January issue of the online English senryu journal *Failed Haiku*. She also won a 2nd in the Illinois State Poetry Society's annual contest.
